





# KUANTAN 188 & ESPLANADE PARK

Touted as the tallest tower in the East Coast and the second tallest tower in Malaysia after KL Tower, Kuantan 188 is Pahang's newest landmark. Kuantan 188 stands at 104 m above ground level, boasting a range of attractions including glass elevators, a viewing deck, restaurants and souvenir shops. Several gravity-defying activities are in the pipeline for adventure-lovers. The design of the tower is inspired by the traditional Malay spear while the viewing deck resembles the flowers and leaves of the white Teruntum plant. The viewing deck affords a magnificent view of Kuantan town as well as surrounding attractions such as Kuantan Waterfront and



#### THE GREAT MINES OF SUNGAI LEMBING Explore the world's deepest and longest underground tin mining

tunnel. In its heyday, Sungai Lembing was a thriving tin-mining area and was dubbed the 'El Dorado of the East'. The Great Mines of Sungai Lembing take visitors back to the glory days of the tin mining era with tours, dioramas and interactive exhibits. The Great Mines is part of an entire area that has been restored to reenact Sungai Lembing's tin mining days. #### MASJID NEGERI SULTAN HAJI AHMAD SHAH Constructed between 1991 and 1993, Masjid Negeri Sultan Ahmad Shah's elegant design is inspired by Ottoman architecture with a grand dome flanked by four smaller domes and four tall minarets at each corner. The mosque, which is also Pahang's State Mosque, is the largest in Pahang and can accommodate at least 8,000 worshippers at a time.



KUANTAN RIVER CRUISE The Kuantan River Cruise takes you on a fascinating journey through the picturesque 500-year-old mangrove forest reserve along the Kuantan River. There is plenty to see, as the 340-hectare swamp is home to an interesting array of estuarine plants, birds and


### KOMPLEKS PENGEMBANGAN TENUN

PAHANG DI RAJA SULTAN HAJI AHMAD SHAH Located in Kampung Soi, this is a treasure trove of Pahang's royal woven fabrics. One of the state's most prestigious products, the intricately woven fabric was originally used by the state's royalty and noblemen. It is now a versatile product and comes in various forms such as ladies traditional attire, men's traditional attire (kain sampin, kain pasang) and even fashioned as home decor, accessories or corporate gifts.

Pahang is the largest state in Peninsular Malaysia. This eco-paradise is filled with remarkable natural treasures. Lush, pristine rainforest rich with a variety of exotic flora and fauna covers almost two-thirds of the state. Its mountainous terrain is home to cool highland retreats, while its long coastline contains some of the most beautiful beaches in the country. The state is also home to the country's largest national park and natural freshwater lakes. Its capital city is Kuantan, a bustling township with plenty of interesting sights.



# GETTING THERE

Kuantan is situated about 260km from Kuala Lumpur, which is approximately 3 ½ hours' drive via the East Coast Highway. Its Sultan Ahmad Shah Airport in Kuantan receives both international and domestic flights from Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA), Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport in Subang and most capital cities all over the country. Air-conditioned express buses to Pahang are also available, departing from Terminal Bersepadu Selatan (TBS) and Hentian Pekeliling in Kuala Lumpur. Keretapi Tanah Melayu or Malayan Railway provides rail services to Mentakab and Kuala Lipis from Kuala Lumpur and Kota Bharu in Kelantan.



# GA GETTING AROUND

Buses and taxis are readily available around Kuantan. Taxis can be found at the city's main hubs such as Kompleks Teruntum, Berjaya Megamall and Jalan Mahkota. To reach other towns in Pahang, outstation buses are available at Hentian Bandar (Jalan Stadium). Tioman Island is accessible by boat and ferry from Teluk Gading in Pahang and Mersing in Johor, and by Berjaya Air's daily direct flights from the Sultan Abdul Aziz Shah Airport in Subang and also





Visitors can find handicrafts made from dried and dyed Pandanus (screwpine) leaves, batik cloths, woodcarvings and other crafts and souvenirs at Crafts Complex (Jalan Pintasan), Sungai Karang and Cherating Village. Witness how traditional fabrics are made at Batik RM in Tanah Putih and Pahang Silk Weaving Centre in Pulau Keladi. Major shopping malls can be found in Pahang's capital city, Kuantan, namely Kuantan Parade, Berjaya Megamall, East Coast Mall and Kuantan City Mall.



Deliciously aromatic, some of Pahang's traditional dishes are said to have been created for royalty. Pahang's local offerings such as Mi Calong, Laksa Pahang, Opor Pahang, Puding Raja, Jeneral Mahbob, Akok Beserah and Lemang Pulut Kera (Pitcher Plant Rice) are worth trying when visiting this state. The best places to find authentic Pahang specialities are Jerantut, Kuala Lipis, Temerloh and Pekan. Temerloh, famous for its silver catfish-based dishes, is



The Royal

Situated at 1,549m above sea level, the Gunung Senyum Recreational Park is a significant archaeological site. Part of the Jengka Forest Reserve, this mountain is estimated to be approximately 3,000 years old. The park has around 19 caves, including Gua Terang Bulan, Gua Hidang, Gua Angin and Gua Gajah. +609 296 2755



#### THE CENTRE OF PENINSULAR MALAYSIA (T3S)

Popularly known as the home of ikan patin (silver catfish), the town of Temerloh has another rarely known feather on its cap. The town is located at a latitude of 03.29'33" and longitude of 102.13'10", making it the centre point for the whole of Peninsular Malaysia, A monument is erected at Kampung Paya Siput Lanchang to mark the exact spot of this geographical allure. ### TASIK BERA (LAKE BERA)

Measuring approximately 35km long and 20km wide, Tasik Bera is Peninsular Malaysia's largest natural freshwater lake. It is also the country's first Ramsar site, an international recognition given to wetland areas for its international importance in nature conservation. Approximately 328 flora species, 200 bird species, 50 mammals and more than 95 fish species inhabit the lake area. +609 250 1700



### TASIK CHINI (LAKE CHINI)

Malaysia's second largest natural lake is filled with a variety of freshwater fish, while the surrounding wilderness is a habitat for a diverse assemblage of flora and fauna. The lake consists of 13 interconnecting water bodies. From August to September, a dazzling display of white and pink water lilies can be seen on the lake's surface.


